
English

This week in English we have continued our learning based on the story 'Omar, the Bees and Me'. The children recapped the facts that they have learnt so far. We then looked at expanded noun phrases. The children had to read facts and add in adjectives to improve the sentence. The children then wrote their improved sentences in their books, focusing on their organisation and presentation of their learning. The following day the children were learning to use coordinating conjunctions; and, or and but. This week the children have had to write a considerable amount and we were very proud of their efforts.

Maths

In Maths this week we have been learning about finding change. We first started off by imagining we went to a shop with a 10p coin and buying a sweet for an amount less than 10p. The children realised there was a link with number bonds to 10. We then increased our amount we had to buy with to 50p and £1. Then children then used hundred squares to support this learning.











Spellings

Next week we will be checking the children's spelling of common exception words, words that are used often but are not easily sounded out. There are a lot more words but this will be a good way of seeing how your children's spelling is getting on.
