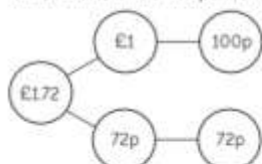
Maths

We started the week with our new maths unit which is money. Year Four began by exploring the use of pounds and pence notation and then we identified that the digits following the decimal point represent part of a pound. This linked to their earlier learning that £1 = 100p and 1 whole = 100 hundredths. After that, children moved from reading and writing money using decimal notation to converting between different types of notation and between different units of money.

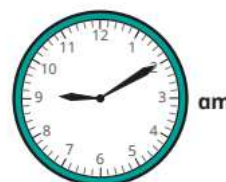


It takes her 1 hour and 45 minutes to get to her friend's house.

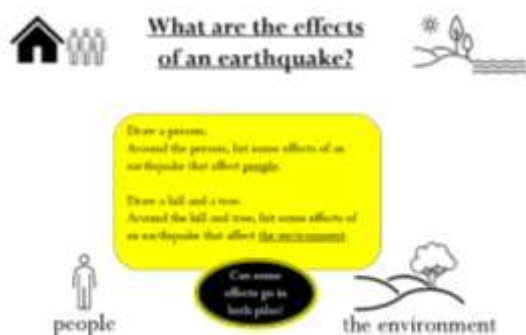


Science

In Science this week we tested sounds in different mediums. We investigated how sounds can be heard through solids, liquids and gases. We compared how sound can travel through tables (solid), water (liquid) and balloons (gas). The children enjoyed exploring how sound waves are produced by all vibrating objects.
