This has been a short, but busy school week! In maths, the children completed our unit about decimals, by solving varied word problems. Our next block of work is titled 'Geometry - properties of shapes.' We began by looking at angles, recognising that a full turn is 360°, a half turn is 180° and a quarter turn is 90°. Clockwise and anti-clockwise turns were made. We moved on to recognising right angles, acute angles, obtuse angles and reflex angles.

In English, first the children wrote predictions. They then showed empathy by describing an event from two different perspectives – a boy's and an orangutan's! Finally, an informal diary entry was written. In science, the children considered the advantages and disadvantages of sexual and asexual reproduction in plants. In RE, we learnt about The Five Pillars of Islam and in PE this week, we had two great, sunny sessions on the field: a cricket lesson and a rounders lesson.

This week, Warren gave a great presentation about Crystal Palace FC. It was clear that he had worked really hard to make his PowerPoint, which he presented with confidence. The children listened well and enjoyed his word search activity too.
