# <u>Olympics Colour/Bubble Run - Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> May</u>

### <u>Home Learning</u>

- 1. We will be having a DT morning and making our instruments on **MONDAY**, so the children need to bring in all their resources. Since there will be a lot of glue and paint involved, the children may wear their own clothes that day obviously something old, since it may get a bit dirty, although I will make sure the children wear aprons.
- 2. The children have been given a maths sheet to complete by next Friday. They need to remember that:
- Angles on a straight line add up to 180°
- Angles around a point add up to 360°
- When two straight lines intersect each other, opposite angles are equal
