This week in maths, the children have multiplied and divided decimal numbers by 10, 100 and 100. They then rounded decimal numbers too. In English, the children wrote a detailed diary entry in the form of a ship's log, then answered some comprehension questions about the next chapter of 'Kensuke's Kingdom.' In science, we looked at how plants can be pollinated by insects or by the wind.

In preparation for our DT project, the children looked at how musical instruments produce sounds in different ways.
