History

Electricity Activities to:

Associate the brightness of a lamp or the volume of a buzzer with the number and voltage of cells used in the circuit

Compare and give reasons for variations in how components function, including the brightness of bulbs, the loudness of buzzers and the on/off position of switches

Use recognised symbols when representing a simple circuit in a diagram.

Computing

The children will be identifying the benefits and risks of mobile devices broadcasting locations of the user and identifying the benefits and risks of giving personal information and device information to access different software.
