Remembrance

On Monday, KS2 had a remembrance service in church, before joining KS1 at the memorial outside for the traditional 2 minutes silence. It was a poignant moment and the children all did us proud.



Remembrance Day Art

The children produced some art linked to remembrance day. They all did a fantastic job! See examples below:



Maths: In maths, we have been learning about equivalent fractions. We have also been focussing on how to simplify fractions. We then looked at identifying fractions on a number line.

English: We have finished reading our class book, Letters from the Lighthouse. The children appeared to really enjoy it. In writing, the children wrote a poem about a lighthouse. We brainstormed words and phrases and recapped personification, in order to make the poem as effective as possible.

Science: This week, the children learnt about the heart in more detail. They learnt the names of the different parts, before acting out the movements of the heart and the blood as it beats.



Anti-bullying Week: As part of anti-bullying week, the children acted out some scenarios, which they then discussed as a class. They also worked in groups to write a rap. In addition, they worked on an anti-bullying poster.
