Dear Parents and Carers,

<u>English</u>

In English, we continued reading *The Man on the Moon* by Simon Bartram. This week, the children have been thinking about the positive and negative aspects of working on the moon. Then they imagined that they blasted off in a rocket to space and wrote a descriptive piece of writing, thinking about what they would be getting up to if they had a day on the moon.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths this week, we have been learning about arrays. The children have been using counters to make their own arrays, thinking carefully about the difference between columns and rows (for example, 2 rows of 4 would look different to 4 rows of 2). We have also recapped doubling numbers this week, thinking about strategies to help find doubles.



Religious Education

In RE, we continued learning about Hanukkah. We recapped the story of Hanukkah and found out some of the different ways that Jewish people celebrate this special occasion.



<u>Computing</u>

We continued using the 'Scratch Junior' programme this week to input instructions to get the sprite to move around the screen. This week, we included a start and end position, as well as connecting a sequence of instructions together.
