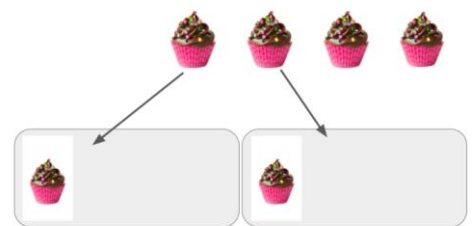
English

This week began by reading a letter that appeared in the magic tin. The letter explained how the 'Cheese Rabbit' has gone missing whilst playing hide-and-seek with its friends. The children made 'Missing' posters, describing the Cheese Rabbit to see if anyone can help find him! Lots of children saw the Cheese Rabbit hopping about school (and even in some homes), so watch out!

The children also did some lovely writing, retelling the events that happened in the 'Little Boat' animation that they watched last week. The children tried hard to start their sentences in different ways.

Maths

In Maths this week, we began by seeing how many different ways we can colour in half of the same shape. Next, we practised recognising equal and unequal groups. We have been sharing counters into equal groups to find half of an amount. The children have been using white boards to draw counters and then sharing them into two groups.



Computing

The children are getting very confident at using Scratch Junior to program their 'Sprite' to move around the screen. This week, we looked at how we can change the number of times the Sprite does a movement. The children have also been exploring how they can make their Sprites grow, shrink and jump!

Moon Rock and Meteorites

As the children have been learning about Neil Armstrong in History recently, we were very lucky to have a special delivery at school. We received some real meteorites and moon rocks from the Science and Technology Facilities Council which we explored in small groups. The children got to hold meteorites from all across the solar system that are billions of years old. We tested to see if they were magnetic, weighed them and used microscopes to look at them in more detail.
