English

Maths

In Maths this week, we focused on finding quarters of shapes by splitting them into four equal parts. The children also had to recognise if shapes had been split into quarters or halves and make comparisons. We also looked at finding quarters of quantities by sharing objects into four equal groups.

Miss Hutchinson organised a special treat for her last math's lesson with the children where they practised cutting pieces of fruit into halves and quarters to make fruit kebabs. The children had a great time and enjoyed eating their fruit kebabs!
