We've had a lovely first week back after the half-term break. The children have adapted brilliantly to the new classroom set-up, sitting at tables instead of on the carpet, as part of their transition towards Year 2.

English

In English, we started a new book called *The Man on the Moon* by Simon Bartram. It tells the story of Bob, who travels to the moon each day for work. The children have enjoyed sequencing the story and retelling it in their own words. We also thought of the different adjectives we could use to describe Bob and wrote descriptive sentences about him.

Maths

In Maths, we've been counting in twos, fives, and tens. The children have been working on number sequences, filling in missing numbers, spotting patterns, and practising counting both forwards and backwards.

Religious Education

In RE, we continued learning about Judaism by exploring the story of Hanukkah. We discussed the idea of miracles and shared what we feel grateful for in our own lives.

Geography

In Geography, we've been learning about the United Kingdom, focusing this week on Belfast, the capital city of Northern Ireland. The children learned some fascinating facts and drew their own maps of Belfast, including some key landmarks.

History

in History, we introduced our new topic of explorers. The children shared ideas about what an explorer is and who they might already know. Over the coming weeks, we'll be learning more about two famous explorers: Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong.

Computing

In Computing, we began our new topic on coding using an app called Scratch Junior. The children really impressed us with their ability to program their sprite characters to move around the screen using simple instructions

PSHE

In PSHE, we've been thinking about changes. We looked at life cycles of different animals and discussed how all living things—including ourselves—grow and change over time.
