<u>English</u>

This week, we have been learning lots of facts about Octopuses. The children worked in partners to record all of the facts they could remember and then wrote their own fact files all about octopuses!

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths this week, we have been looking at 100. The numbers to children been have identifying how many tens and ones are in two digit numbers and writing number sentences. They used the tens and ones dienes to create hair and teeth for monster faces and work out how old the monsters were by adding the tens and ones together!



<u>PSHE</u>

This week, we explored the differences between boys and girls. After chatting about things like clothing and hair, the children quickly realised that the real difference lies in our private parts. We talked about what "private" means (something personal and not for everyone to see) and had thoughtful discussions about where and with whom it is appropriate to be private.

We also learned the correct names for boys' and girls' private parts and shared some of the names we might use at home. Naturally, there were a few giggles, but the children really impressed us with their sensible ideas and respectful conversations.

That said, I've made a note to myself not to teach about testicles and tentacles in the same week again — to avoid any confusion!
