This week, the children were creating a story to place their mythical creature into during English lessons. To understand what a myth is, we watched some examples, starting with King Midas. The children then wrote a paragraph to describe their mythical creature, ensuring that they described its personality and appearance. After this, the children had a planning session to build a mythical story involving their character. The focus for their writing was description. The children were encouraged to use a thesaurus to try to find some more mature adjectives; this helps them to build a picture of their character.
