Next week is a busy week for Year 3. On Tuesday we will go over to Leybourne Castle to learn a little bit about its history and to try some sketching for art. Some children were also narrating their story into the iPad to enable them to structure their writing. It was enjoyable reading them and I am so pleased to see writing improving and the content being coherent and descriptive.

During our PSHE session this week, the children were looking at how to keep themselves safe in their everyday life. We looked at some hazards around the home to see if the children understood what keeps them safe and what doesn't. I was impressed with their responses.

In athletics this week, the children were thinking about their sprinting skills and working out how they could ensure that they utilise their body to become faster. This was through leaning forward a little when running and not stopping as they reach their end goal. We played a game involving racing to collect bean bags and the children had lots of fun.
