

# Year 4 Newsletter

## MTC

Year Four have done amazingly well on their Multiplication Check that they sat a couple of weeks ago – we are so proud of every single one of them for all of their hard work. Thank you for your support in helping the children to achieve such fantastic results. The children were told their marks on Monday, if they wanted to know. A copy of these results will also be included in your reports that will go out in July.

## Maths

Children ended their unit on Shape this week by completing symmetrical figures. Children began by considering squares on a grid shaded with a horizontal or vertical line of symmetry. They either chose to use a mirror or to count how far away each square was from the line of symmetry. When children were secure with vertical and horizontal lines of symmetry, they moved on to looking at diagonal lines of symmetry. Children found completing diagonal lines of symmetry quite tricky but we got there in the end!

We have also solved time-related problems. We converted units of time.

## Transition

This week, Year Four produced booklets for Mrs Ward (their new teacher in September) to tell her all about themselves including their likes/ dislikes, favourite lessons and any worries they have about Year Five.

## Science

Our final Science topic is Sound. On Tuesday, Year Four learnt that sound is a type of energy made by vibrations. When an object, such as a guitar's string, vibrates it causes air particles around it to vibrate too. This causes the air particles next to those to vibrate, and the ones next to those and so on and so on. This is called a sound wave. We carried out three investigations to see the effects that sound makes.

## Spellings

Group A: children's, parents', cats', boys', people's, foxes', dogs', babies', men's and friends'.

(we have learnt previously that an apostrophe for a plural word ending in 's' is placed after the 's')

Group B: coming, couldn't, cried, dark, didn't and different.
