PE


We are still reading Danny the Champion of the World.

<u>Maths</u>

In maths, we have been exploring angles as turns. Children explored full, half and quarter turns, using the language of clockwise and anticlockwise. After this, we moved onto describing angles. The class classified angles as acute, right or obtuse.

We have also learnt to add mixed numbers and fractions and subtracting two fractions.

All the children worked well on these problems.



Science

Our new science topic is electricity. This week we looked at what electrical appliances and non-electrical appliances were. Children grouped appliances based on whether they are mains- or battery-powered, presenting their findings in a Venn diagram.



Maths Day

On Monday 9th June, we will have a maths themed day where the class will take part in lots of fun times tables themed activities. Year Four have their multiplication check on Tuesday 10th June. It would be really beneficial to practise times tables with your child over the weekend.

RE

In RE, the children learnt the names and importance of some of the gods and goddesses in Hindu Dharma.
