Emergent Layer	The tallest layer of the rainforest. The trees can be up to 150 feet tall.	Continent	The world's main continuous pieces of land (Africa, Asia, Australasia, Europe, North America, South America, Antarctica).	
Canopy	Dense layer of trees overlapping each other. Home to most animals in rainforests.
