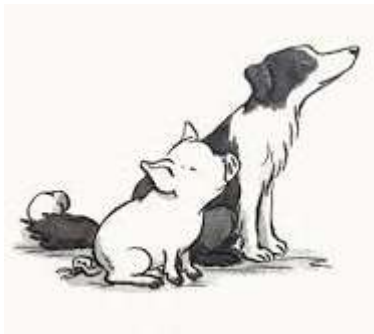


# Year 3 Newsletter

## English






We have also learnt how to relate analogue time to digital time (12 hours).


