In maths this week, all of the children looked at multiplying by 5 and 10. Some of the children moved onto learning the difference between sharing and grouping, whilst others focused on securing their addition and subtraction written methods. Every child will be focusing on multiplication and division in some format over the next couple of weeks.

The children were writing their fact-files this week; some of them completed them and others still have some sub-headings left to finish. The children are able to understand that a fact file will have a heading, sub-headings, factual information and pictures or diagrams. This week for SPaG, the children were finding as many root words as possible to put with prefixes such as: un, dis and pre.

The children are really enjoying playing the ukuleles and will have a fun Christmas session in a couple of weeks.

In History this week, the children were learning about the importance of the River Nile. They learnt what it meant to the Egyptians and how it was vital for building work, irrigation and to enable them to feed themselves. The children made a poster demonstrating all of those facts.
