A snapshot of our week



English:

This week, the children wrote a set of instructions for how to capture a dragon. Initially, we brainstormed imperative verbs, time conjunctions and adverbs together, before the children wrote their step-by-step instructions.

Science:

In Science, the children were set some electrical challenges to solve. We then drew simple diagrams to show what we had done. The children were reminded that although wire is bendy, when drawing a diagram, the wire is represented by a straight line drawn by a ruler.

Maths:

In maths, the children learnt how to compare and order numerators and denominators. They have also been adding and subtracting fractions - when doing this, they have to convert to ensure the fractions have a common denominator.

History:

The children wrote an information text about the Home Guard. They included when and why the Home Guard was set up and who was asked to join. They also wrote about the very limited training they received and how some of them had to make their own weapons.
