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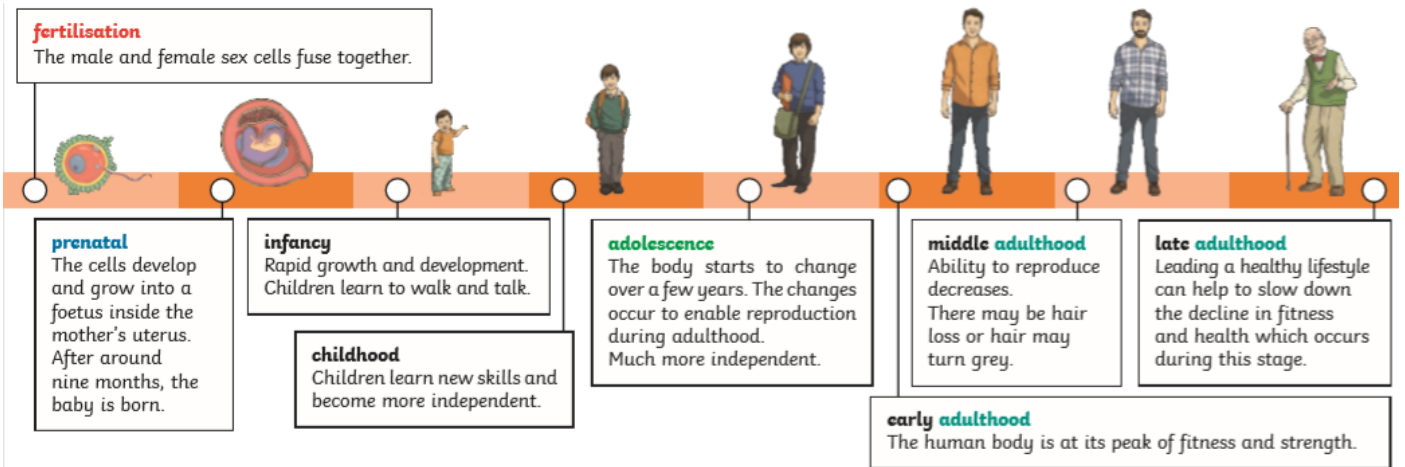
Key Knowledge

To be able to describe the life cycle of humans from fertilised egg to baby, up through child and adult to old age.

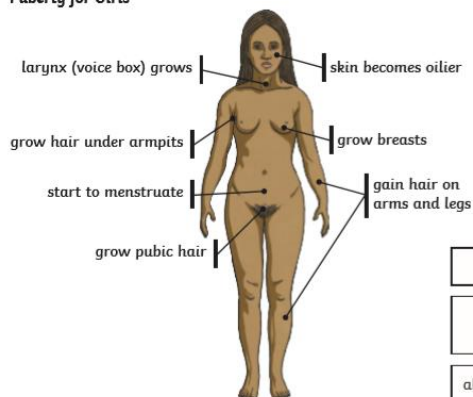
To know how boys' and girls' bodies change during puberty.

Key Vocabulary

adolescence	The social and emotional stag of development between childhood and adulthood	life expectancy	The length of time, on average, that a particular animal is expected to live.
adulthood	The stage of development when a human is fully developed and mature	menstruation	When the female body discharges the lining of the uterus. This happens approximately once a month
asexual reproduction	A process where one parent produces new life	prenatal	The stage of development from the time of fertilisation to the time of birth.
fertilisation	The process of the male and female sex cells fusing together.	puberty	The physical stage of development between childhood and adulthood
gestation	The process or time when prenatal development takes place before birth.	reproduce	To produce young
life cycle	The changes a living thing goes through, including reproduction.	sexual reproduction	A process where two parents – one male and one female – are required to produce new life.
