Breaktime Snacks

The Year 3 Rocket!

I thought it would be useful for you to see the behaviour system that I use with the children in Year 3. The children all have a peg which starts on the green square in the morning. The peg can move up for excellent behaviour or work. Alternatively, the pegs move down if the children need to have a think about the choices that they are making. If the children move up to the blue section, they receive 20 team points. If they continue to work hard and are invited to move their peg up once more, they reach the purple section, earning them a raffle ticket. On a Friday afternoon, a raffle ticket will be drawn from the pot and someone will win a prize from our sparkly box! There are lots of other opportunities for the children to earn raffle tickets throughout the week too, they are not exclusively linked to the rocket.

<u>Music</u>

This year, we are lucky enough to have Mr Jaggard teaching the children how to play the ukulele. These sessions will begin next Tuesday (14/09/21). 


<u>Maths</u>

For the next few weeks, we will cover place value in our maths lessons. This week, we used base-10 to make, draw and represent different 2 and 3-digit numbers. Then, we practised partitioning numbers into hundreds, tens and ones by thinking about the value of each digit. We used part- whole models to partition numbers.

To the right is an example of how we can represent numbers in number form, words, addition sums and using resources (using base 10).

We re-capped our learning from Year 2 to ensure that all of the important objectives from that year group had been met in order for us to access the Year 3 learning confidently. We will do this



throughout the year to ensure the children have covered all leaning required.

English

This week, we started the week with some free writing. The children were encouraged to simply write for pleasure and to use all of the resources that are there to help them in school such as vocabulary books, dictionaries and word mats. We spent the remainder of the week focusing on sentence structure and punctuation to re-cap key expectations in writing. They have worked super-hard and I have really enjoyed reading their writing throughout the week. I can see that we have some beautiful handwriting already in class. We will work on our letter formation over the next couple of weeks with discrete handwriting lessons to ensure that the children are joining correctly and writing in a neat, cursive style.

Spellings and Times Tables

This morning (Friday), the children sat their first spelling test. The children have been sent home with their spelling books in order for you to view their results. Please ensure that spelling books are returned by next Friday for the next test.

Times tables tests will be sat on a **Thursday** afternoon. Results for these will come home with the children on a Friday. We will begin testing on Thursday 23rd September. I will send out more information on the times tables test nearer the time.
